Whereas the Province of Manitoba has recently announced amendments to the Agricultural Crown Lands Leases and Permits Regulation; And Whereas the disallowance of the transfer of Crown Lands Leases to be combined with the sale of private land to a new purchaser may create a decrease in the assessed values of the privately owned land; And whereas the amended Regulation, may result in non-local large operations to come in and take over substantial parcels of Crown Land in a Municipality, which would displace the existing ranching operations, cause the inability to pay expenses, including municipal taxes, and create the requirement to relocate to larger centres to obtain employment, which would in turn result in a decrease in population; And whereas the removal of Crown Land Leases from the present ranch operations would create inaccessibility to the new operations and place large demands on Municipalities to provide infrastructure; Therefore, be it resolved that the Association of Manitoba Municipalities lobby the Provincial Government to reconsider the proposed changes to the Crown Lands Lease process as the changes will negatively impact the economy of our Municipalities; And further be it resolved that proposed amendments to the Agricultural Crown Lands Leases and Permits Regulation be done in consultation with the Producers.
